Champions Emerge in NAL National Finals at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show and NAL West Coast Finals at the Las Vegas National Horse Show

Equestrian sport's best hunters and jumpers converged at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show in Harrisburg, PA, and the Las Vegas National Horse Show, in Las Vegas, NV, to compete for top honors in the 2012 North American League (NAL) Finals.

Following the Finals, eleven top riders emerged as Champions, six at Harrisburg and five at Las Vegas.

Everyone who competed in the NAL Finals at Harrisburg and Las Vegas received a gift bag with an assortment of gifts from the NAL and SmartPak including a commemorative NAL Finals stall plaque. Winners also received an array of awards including trophies, NAL coolerettes, certificates for an NAL scrim from the Clothes Horse, grooming totes, and bridles donated by SmartPak.

The NAL runs season-long series in six divisions — Children's Hunter, Adult Hunter, Children's Jumper, Adult Jumper, Pony Jumper, and Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper.

The NAL qualifying period for the year-end finals began on September 1, 2011 and ended on August 31, 2012. Riders do not need to be members of the NAL to compete in any qualifying classes, but only current members earn points toward year-end finals. Join today to ensure yourself a spot in next year's Finals in Harrisburg and Las Vegas!



Julie Holzberger and Revealed Win the \$10,000 Adult Amateur Hunter National Final Presented by Practical Horseman

Revealed and Julie Holzberger of Fairfield, OH revealed their championship ways by winning in the \$10,000 North American League Adult Amateur Hunter National Final, presented by Practical Horseman, at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show. This was the first year Holzberger competed in the Final and her first time at Harrisburg.

"I am so thrilled," said Holzberger. "I love competing here and in the NAL. I am so blessed. You always have a high expectation. You always go into it striving for something great and then I always have to step back and say, you know what, it's not about that, it's about riding consistently and doing the best I can."

Holzberger and "Clay", as he is affectionately called, did perform the best in the first round receiving the highest score of 87 points in the field of 28 qualifiers. Holzberger was surprised with the result, but not her groom.

"I was so excited when I received the highest score in the first round. Clay is just such an amazing animal," said Holzberger. "It was funny because Fred, one of our grooms said, '87' when I walked into the ring. Then I walked out with an 87 and he said, 'see!' I told him to stop because I still had one more round to go."

The second round proved more difficult, as the pair was only able to earn an 81.5, giving them a combined score of 168.5. This was just barely enough to win the Championship; second place went to Laura Barna of Dallas, PA, with a score of 168.

Holzberger trains with Dave Belford and Chris Payne of New Hope Farm in Cincinnati, OH, and gives them much of the credit for her success. "They are such amazing trainers, I adore them. I have been with them for almost ten years. I can't imagine my life without those two as my mentors," said Holzberger. "I stopped riding for 25 years and came back to it ten years ago. I never intended to come back and compete. I just wanted to ride for pleasure and the next thing I know I own horse and I'm showing and I'm like, wow!"

Hannah Murrin and Landdame Win the \$10,000 Adult Amateur Jumper National Final

Landdame was the “grand dame” of Harrisburg winning the \$10,000 North American League Adult Amateur Jumper National Final. The 21-year-old Hanoverian mare, owned by Whipstick Farm and shown by Hannah Murrin of New York, NY, proved that age is only a number by topping the field of 30 in the NAL Final. Murrin was overcome with emotion.

“It’s been really exciting. I’m about to cry,” said Murrin. “I am so happy that my parents gave me this opportunity to come here and the opportunity to have such a wonderful horse. It means so much to win here.”

Seven horses made it into the jump-off by going without fault in the first round. Alexandra Cherubini and Equifit Carlos posted the first clear round in a time of 37.019 seconds, which eventually left them in third place. Murrin had two horses that made it into the jump-off, and she went first on Landdame. The pair took over the lead, going penalty free in 35.831 seconds. Rebecca Smith and Kick the Clouds also went clear, but just a bit too slow finishing in a time of 36.070 for second place.

Four more riders, including Murrin on Valentina, tried to take over the lead, but were unsuccessful. No one was more proud than Murrin’s trainer and owner of Landdame, Frank Cunniffe, with whom Murrin has been training three years.

“She is in better shape than I am,” said Cunniffe about the mare. “Everyone laughed when I bought her, because of her age, but she proved them wrong. She really did a super job and so did Hannah.”

This was her first year riding in the North American League. Murrin said, “It was my first time in Harrisburg. It was an opportunity to prove to my parents and my trainer that it was worth putting in the work and that for my parents it was worth supporting me. To be able to do this means the world to me.”

Madison Goetzmann and Sirius Black Win the \$10,000 Children's Hunter National Final

Madison Goetzmann, of Skaneateles, NY, piloted Sirius Black, owned by Christina Gellos, to victory in the \$10,000 North American League Children's Hunter National Final at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show. Lily Blavin of Scottsdale, AZ, and Pringle were the Reserve Champions.

The competition was fierce. Goetzmann was worried about Blavin, who came to the NAL Finals as the year-end division leader. "I was thinking even before we started that Lily was going to be tough competition because she's got a lot of nice horses," said the 12-year-old rider.

They both have nice horses. Blavin and Goetzmann each qualified two entries for the second round, which consisted of the top 12 horses. Normally, they return in reverse order of merit, but the

order of go was adjusted to allow each one sufficient time to prepare their horses.

Goetzmann went first in the final round on Balisto scoring a respectable 73 points for a two-round score of 156. Blavin and Pringle went third and improved on their first round score of 81 with an 84 for an overall tally of 165. They were in the lead, but Goetzmann and "Black" received an impressive 87 points in the first round, so they had a bit of a cushion for their second trip. They received a slightly lower score of 86 on their Final ride, for an overall score of 173 points, more than enough for the win.

Goetzmann was pleased with their performance, she said, "I thought my round was really smooth. It was consistent and I was really proud of it."

She started riding in the North American League at the age of six, though this was her first final. Goetzmann started in the Pony Hunter division, and then moved on to the Children's Hunter this past April.

Goetzmann is now the proud owner of the new Laura Palmer Pickett Memorial Perpetual Trophy donated by Annie and Barbara Friedman.

Anna Cardelfe and Wenda AK win the \$5,000 Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper National Final Presented by SmartPak

Anna Cardelfe of Spring Lake, NJ, and Wenda AK won the \$5,000 North American League Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper National Final, presented by SmartPak. The 17-year-old high school senior has only been competing in the jumper division for one year, so winning at Harrisburg was beyond her expectations.

“I never expected to do this well. Just getting into the Final was an accomplishment, but it was even sweeter to win here and be a champion,” said Cardelfe. “Wenda was awesome! She taught me the ropes in the jumpers. I couldn’t ask for a better teacher to bring me along.”

Cardelfe was also grateful to her other teacher, Stacia Madden of Beacon Hill Farm in Colt’s Neck, NJ. It was Madden’s idea for the young rider to venture into the jumper division. “Stacia thought that riding in the jumper division would enhance my riding and it would be a lot of fun,” said Cardelfe. “I was a little skeptical at first because I didn’t really like the jumpers, I rode the hunters, but after I did my first show it was such a rush and I have been hooked ever since.

“Going first is always nerve-racking because you have to set the bar, but I wasn’t really that nervous going first on Wenda because I knew that she could do it and I could do it and that hopefully together we would get the win,” said Cardelfe. “I deviated from my plan a little bit, which I don’t like to do, but I couldn’t have been happier with the way she went. She was awesome.”

Her mother, Lynn Cardelfe, was beyond happy. “I can’t even explain how I felt when my daughter won,” said Lynn. “It was really very exciting. I just kept holding my breath. It was a really great moment for her and for me! I was thrilled.”

Katherine “Katie” Pontone of Red Bank, NJ, and Wicked blazed to victory in the \$4,000 North American League Pony Jumper National Final on the Opening Day of the Pennsylvania National Horse Show. The pair managed the only double clear out of the four that made it into the jump-off. Pontone was surprised with the results.

“I thought it was really difficult,” Pontone said of the course. “So coming here and winning was the best. My mom and trainers helped me so much to get here and Wicked is just the best. My expectation was to get over the first jump. After that, Wicked kind of took over and got the job done. She tries so hard every time.”

Pontone and Wicked cleared more than a few obstacles on the road to Harrisburg. They began the NAL season two months late because Pontone did not acquire Wicked until June. The 13-year-old mare is blind in her right eye. Yet the pair managed to qualify and enter the NAL Finals as the year-end leaders of the division.

This is the last year for the 18-year-old Pontone as a Junior rider and her last year competing with Wicked. Although her future plans include competing with a new horse, she hopes they both will return to Harrisburg.

“In a couple weeks I’ll have my last show with her,” Pontone said of Wicked. “Hopefully I will come back here next year with my next horse and hopefully Wicked will be here too with her new owner and I’ll get to watch her go again.”

Nina Montross and Caprifol Win the \$10,000 Children's Jumper National Final

Despite a two-month layoff from riding, Nina Montross of Bedford, NY, and Caprifol impressively captured the \$10,000 North American League Children's Jumper National Final at the 67th Annual Pennsylvania National Horse Show. The talented 14-year-old high school freshman was on an equestrian hiatus in order to attend Westminster School in Simsbury, CT.

"I was nervous because I had not ridden in two months," said Montross. "But I was really excited and just happy to be back riding. I got up early this morning and rode before the class and that was really the first time I did it in a couple of months. I wasn't expecting to win it, but I was hoping."

Montross faced a field of thirty, which yielded to seven competitors for the jump-off, including the 2011 NAL Pony Jumper Champion Noah Buehler while riding Shane. Buehler and Shane posted the fastest time without fault of 43.315 seconds before Montross entered the show ring. Caprifol and Nina rode a clear round and posted a blazing fast time of 40.187, giving her the Championship.

"I have had my horse for almost two years and she is so fast. She's a little speed demon," said Montross. "She is my favorite. I love her and my other horse, Ohio. They are both really fast horses. That's what I like about them."

Montross started riding when she was three, doing hunters, and then switched to jumpers. Her goal this year was to qualify for the NAL Finals. Montross also dreams of competing in the grand prix. She said of the win, "Today was a really good memory, I wasn't expecting to win it, but I love that I did!"

Chris Fellers and Cascade Win the \$5,000 Adult Amateur Jumper West Coast Final

Chris Fellers, of Wilsonville, OR, was the Adult Amateur Jumper winner at this year's NAL West Coast Finals at the Las Vegas National Horse Show.

The 21-year-old junior at Linfield College rode Cascade, or "Casey" as he's called around the barn, against fourteen other competitors. After riding a fault-free round, Fellers had to face three entries in the jump-off. Fellers won the jump-off by less than three-tenths of a second. He credited the quickness of Cascade during a crucial part of the course for giving them the win. "He's got incredible ground speed," said Fellers. "Ground speed to the last fence is where I got it."

Speaking of Cascade, Fellers said, "He can be a difficult horse at times, but for the most part he is an awesome teammate. He understands his job, and when we head in to any ring to compete, I can tell he is very focused and ready to do his best. I am very lucky to have him."

Fellers said of the NAL West Coast Finals, "It was an awesome experience. Going into the Final I thought that if I could ride well and execute the plan my parents had come up with, I would have a good shot to be competitive."

Fellers started riding when he was young, but took a number of years off. He returned to riding in 2010, and this was his first year competing in the NAL. He hopes that he can continue being successful, as he plans on turning professional when the time is right.

"After college I plan to continue riding and turn professional when I am ready," he said. "Although I started late, horses are my life now, and I can't imagine it any other way."

Fellers credits much of his success to the training he's received under his parents, Rich, a member of the U.S. Team at the 2012 London Olympic Games and the current FEI World Cup Champion, and Shelley, a successful Grand Prix rider. They have trained their son for his whole career. He sees winning the NAL's West Coast Final as his biggest accomplishment. "Winning this Final would be my biggest accomplishment so far," he said. "But since I have only been riding for two years, I like to think my biggest accomplishment is yet to come!"

Kellie Byer and Annestasia Win the \$5,000 Children's Jumper West Coast Final

Kellie Byer, of Torrance, CA, won the Children's Jumper Championship at the NAL West Coast Finals. The high school sophomore started riding at age seven, and her first time competing in the NAL was at the 2011 Las Vegas National Horse Show.

The competition for the Children's Jumper Championship was intense with 23 horses competing for the title. Eight of the young horse-and-rider combinations rode fault-free in the first round. Three then rode clear in the jump-off, with Byer taking first and second place aboard Annestasia and Bonbini, respectively.

She said of her first position with Annestasia going into the jump-off, "She's got a long stride and she's pretty fast so I thought my time might be able to hold up."

Winning at the Las Vegas National Horse Show was special for Byer, as it is her favorite show of the year. "I look forward to it every year because I love the venue. I also like the competition at this show. It's a great way to end the show season and compete with a lot of talented riders."

Byer trains with Erin Isom and Alden Giacopuzzi of Alderin Sporthorses, based in Palos Verdes Estates, CA. Her training includes working directly under Isom, as well as keeping a rigorous

riding schedule. "I am a working student for Erin, so I ride seven days a week," she said.

She considers maturing as a competitor to be her biggest accomplishment. "I have gotten over a lot of my show nerves from the amount of time I spend on horses and all the horse shows I have been fortunate enough to attend," she said.

She hopes that all of her training aids her in her riding goals. "I am working my way up to the Grand Prix and I hope to be an international rider one day."

Asked about her thoughts on winning her class in the NAL West Coast Finals, Byer said, "I was proud of my horse's performance, and I am so happy not only for myself but for my trainers and my barn."

Lily Blavin and Montague Win the \$5,000 Children's Hunter West Coast Final

Lily Blavin, of Scottsdale, AZ, won the Children's Hunter Final at the NAL West Coast Finals. The 15-year-old has been riding a long time, and is no stranger to competition. "I started riding when I was five years old and started competing when I was seven. I started riding in the North American League just this past year!"

Sixteen competitors entered the Children's Hunter Final. Riders competed in two rounds, with the sum of their two scores determining the Champion. Blavin, riding Montague, was able to post the highest score, 84, in the first round for a comfortable lead as the next highest score was 77. The second round saw Blavin claim the second best score of 84, only slightly behind the second round's winner, Mikayla Stewart, who earned 87 points. The combined score of 168 gave her the Championship.

This is Blavin's first year competing in a NAL Final, and she was excited about winning the Championship. "I am so happy about winning the class," said Blavin, who topped the regular season standings in the NAL's Children's Hunter division. "Right as I went in for my final round, I saw the score board and the girl who just went scored an 87 and took over the lead. I was very nervous because I really wanted to win and that put the pressure on even more. After I jumped the first jump I relaxed and

we had a great round! It was very smooth and consistent and he was jumping amazing! I was very happy!"

Blavin rides with Archie Cox out of Brookway Stables in Los Angeles. "I have been training with Archie since January of this year," she said. "I ride every weekend Friday through Sunday. During the summer, I ride basically all week, except the days the horses get off, of course! I owe so much to Archie. He's the best!"

Blavin has won multiple hunter championships, and considers the NAL West Coast Finals Championship to be among her greatest accomplishments, and one she hopes will aid her in her future as a rider. "I consider my biggest accomplishment to be winning the NAL West Coast Final," she said. "My goal as a rider is to compete at hunter derby finals and eventually ride in the jumpers."

Emily Winkler and Landmark Win the \$5,000 Adult Amateur Hunter West Coast Final Presented by Practical Horseman

Emily Winkler, of Long Beach, CA, won the Adult Amateur Hunter Division, presented by Practical Horseman, at the NAL West Coast Final. Winkler started riding when she was six years old, and started riding in the NAL this year.

Winkler entered the Adult Amateur Hunter Final aboard her horse Landmark. Twelve competitors entered the Hunter Final and competed in two rounds, with the combined score deciding the winner. The first round saw Winkler with the third best score of 80, but she was able to capture the Championship with a second round score of 85, as her combined score of 165 was the best overall.

This was Winkler's first time competing in a NAL Final. "I was honored to win this great class," she said. "I didn't know how my horse was going to be in the indoor ring but he was fantastic. Plus I wanted to ride well since this was the last big class that I was competing in for my 2012 show season."

Winkler has built a solid relationship with her trainer over time. "My trainer is Tracy Baer, the trainer at Windsong Farm in Huntington Beach, CA. I've been training with Tracy for 10 years."

Winkler balances being a full-time doctoral student at Mount Saint Mary's College with training and competing, and even finds opportunities to combine her passions. "I'm working on my doctorate

degree in Physical Therapy. I actually have an internship next summer at the Shea Center where I will be working primarily with kids and therapeutic riding."

Her future plans include keeping an eye on both her professional and riding careers. "My goal in life is to start my own physical therapy corporation. As far as a rider, my goal is to compete back east in the 3'6" A/O hunters."

Winkler said that she especially enjoyed the year-end competition at the NAL West Coast Finals. "My favorite NAL experience would have to be this past weekend in Las Vegas and being able to compete indoors. It was a great way to end my 2012 show season on my horse."

Jaclyn Jarrell and Barthez win the \$5,000 Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper West Coast Final Presented by SmartPak

Jaclyn Jarrell, of Calgary, Canada, claimed the Championship in the Low Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper Division, Presented by SmartPak, aboard Barthez at the NAL West Coast Final.

Jarrell has ridden Barthez for six years riding him first as a Children's Hunter before moving him to the jumper ring. In the NAL Final, only three of the 22 entries were able to reach the jump-off with fault-free rides. Two of these had clear rounds in the jump-off where Jarrell wound up winning the championship with a time of 37.316 seconds. Jenny Calandra placed second with a jump-off time of 38.194 on Nefertiti Du Verger. Finishing third was the only other entry with a clean first round, Taylor Harris on Quintus Z.

Jarrell, a nursing school student, tried to prepare throughout the year for the Finals. "We tried to do as many NAL classes as we could all year," said Jarrell. "The NAL Finals are great; it's like competing in the big indoor shows in the East. It's a real good way to finish the year."
