The North American League (NAL) offers year-long series in six divisions – Children's Hunter Presented by Charles Ancona, Adult Hunter Presented by LAURACEA, Adult Jumper Presented by SmartPak, Children's Jumper Presented by EquiFit, Medium Junior/Amateur Jumper Presented by Parlanti, and Low Junior/Amateur Jumper. The series includes classes held at hundreds of horse shows across the United States and Canada, giving riders in these divisions a chance to ride in year-end finals at two major shows – the West Coast Finals at the International Jumping Festival hosted by Blenheim EquiSports in San Juan Capistrano, CA, September 20-24, and the National Finals at the Capital Challenge Horse Show at the Prince George's Equestrian Center in Upper Marlboro, MD, September 28-October 8.

New this year, NAL Children's and Adult Hunter Finals at the Capital Challenge will take place over the weekend of September 30-October 1. NAL has also added a Welcome class for both Hunter divisions, with the Children's Welcome running on Friday and the Adult Welcome on Saturday. Jumper Finals will remain during the week of October 2. Entries will open on ShowManagementSystem.com on August 1 and close on September 4.

The NAL qualifying season runs from September 1 through August 31. NAL qualifying classes are open to all competitors, but only current members are awarded points. "My ponies and horses have always done so much for me, so I feel like I should give kindness, patience and my best riding back to them," she said. "Chris has the best way of explaining things so I can do just that."

Peyson got her first horse, the 15-year-old Warmblood gelding Dubai, in November 2022, and she can't imagine having a better first horse. "Doobie always gives his very best effort, and I appreciate him so much," she said. "Because of him, we've earned champion at almost every show we've been to. Around the barn, he's extremely silly, very personable, and so gentle and kind. When he sees anyone coming, he stretches his neck out, tilts his head, and starts wagging his tongue! Peyson has had a wonderful season with "Doobie" and looks forward to showing at the Pennsylvania National Horse Show and Washington International Horse Show. She wants to enjoy every stride with him as well as her Junior horse, Lewis, and hopes to make her way to the Maclay Finals and eventually the grand prix someday.


